**Free Canine Massage and Flyball Demonstrations at PAWSwalk**

Seattle—Complimentary canine massage and flyball demonstrations are just two of the animal-friendly events at this year's PAWSwalk on Saturday, September 11 at Seattle's Magnuson Park. More than 1,200 people and their dogs are expected to attend the event, presented by 98.9 KWJZ, which will raise funds for homeless, orphaned and injured animals at PAWS.

When PAWS asked friend and supporter Capt. Steve Baer of the Seattle Fire Department why he and his canine partner Henny take part in PAWSwalk, he said, "Now that I'm an adult (or mostly) I've realized I can't take home every stray or injured animal I come across. But by raising money for an organization like PAWS I feel like I'm able to help them in an indirect way, even if I can't take them home with me."

Walkers will take a 5k stroll through the park, then enjoy animal-friendly shopping, dog agility demonstrations, a human/canine look-alike contest, a kids' zone, and [more](#). There will also be PAWS' wildlife experts on hand to answer questions about solving conflicts with wildlife, and PAWS dogs available for adoption.
